EXHIBITIONS



Flora Imaginaria: The Flower in Contemporary Photography

Through September 25

"The Year of Photography" continues at Selby Gardens' Downtown Sarasota campus with an exhibition of floral photography that features the work of nearly 50 contemporary artists. *Flora Imaginaria* highlights the beauty and diversity of flowers, which have long been appreciated aesthetically for their colors and forms, as well as for their decorative potential and symbolic power. The exhibition was co-developed in partnership with the Foundation for the Exhibition of Photography (FEP) and curators William Ewing and Danaé Panchaud. All photographic works have been produced within the last three decades, and the varied artwork is displayed both inside the Museum of Botany & the Arts and outside in the Gardens, providing visitors a unique encounter with art in the context of nature.



The Orchid Show 2022: Capturing the Perfect Shot

October 15 to December 4

Selby Gardens' annual *Orchid Show* will celebrate the beauty and diversity of orchids by featuring the stunning scientific photography of our own rare orchid collection. The show will be built around photographs taken by a group of dedicated volunteers for research purposes that also stand on their own as fine art. Images will be on display in the Tropical Conservatory and the Museum of Botany & the Arts.



Seeing the Invisible: An Augmented Reality Contemporary Art Exhibition

Extended through September 2023

The most ambitious and expansive exhibition to date of contemporary artworks created with augmented reality (AR) technology. *Seeing the Invisible* features works by more than a dozen international artists, including Ai Weiwei, Refik Anadol, El Anatsui, and Sarah Meyohas—including several artists' debut work in AR. Visitors engage with the exhibition through a custom app that they can download to their smartphones or tablets. This show is simultaneously on view at several other gardens and museums across a number of countries, highlighting the power of art in a natural setting to connect people around the world.
