WHAT?

Nature is all around us, even in our cities! Let's get to know the plants and animals in Sarasota and Manatee counties.

The **City Nature Challenge (CNC)** is an international effort to get people outside to take pictures of their local biodiversity. Over the course of four days, citizens around the world will take as many pictures of the natural world as they can. Experts will then look at the pictures and see how many different species were shared!

IT'S A FRIENDLY COMPETITION!

We are partnering with **The Nature Conservancy in Orlando** to host a friendly competition among several Florida metro areas and we're calling on everyone to participate!

CNC was started in 2016 by the Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County and the California Academy of Sciences as a competition between LA and San Francisco. Since then, it's grown to include more than 400 cities, in more than 40 countries, across six continents!

WHO?

YOU! You do not need to be a professional photographer, botanist, or naturalist to be participate. All you need is a smartphone or GPS-enabled camera, a free iNaturalist app, and a willingness to get out and explore!

WHERE?

In your backyard, playgrounds, parks, and more. Basically, anywhere that you find nature in Sarasota and Manatee counties!

WHY?

Through documenting all the plants and animals in our community, we will discover what we need to protect.

HOW?

Join the project on **iNaturalist**, by creating a free account and searching for the **City Nature Challenge Sarasota and Manatee Counties project**. Spread the word and encourage others to participate as well. It's as easy as finding wildlife, taking a picture, and sharing!
